The multidisciplinary programme “Investing in an Uncertain Future” at the Institute for Advanced Studies in Glasgow explores the way we model values and uncertainties about the future for public policy analysis, bringing together economists, management scientists, scenario planners, horizon scanners, psychologists, political scientists, statisticians and others.
